

A Morning Workshop (11 am – noon)

A1: The Seven Stories We Live By

The class will explore for electronic meeting platforms, and include a detailed experience with the Zoom format.

B1: The State of the Presbytery

This workshop will look at trends within the presbytery, including church size, the number of retiring pastors, what it will take for a church to sustain a full-time pastor, and what options a congregation would have if it is not able to afford a full time pastor. **Leader: Ed Thompson, General Presbyter, Presbytery of WV**

B2: Session Record Review

This is an opportunity for Clerks of Session to attend Festival of Faith and bring their Session records for annual review (Book of Order, G-3.0108a). This is the primary Records Review event for the Charleston area of Presbytery; however, Clerks of Session from throughout the presbytery are invited to participate. In addition to reviewing records, participants will be provided with helpful information to be a better Clerk of Session. Please note: records must be accompanied by the Clerk of Session, a Ruling Elder member of Session or pastor in order to be reviewed.

B3: Is this Call for Me/Them??

This workshop is designed for those who may have sensed, or wonder if they've sensed, a call to ministry. It's also for those who may have sensed someone whom they know is called to ministry and wonder how to help them discern that call. (Ministry here refers to either a call as a minister, Christian educator, missionary, or something else.)

This workshop will focus on the curriculum and its components; uses in ministry settings; and reviews by those who are currently using it.

The *Top Ten List* of polity mistakes (and how to avoid them) will be highlighted. Let's learn to be better moderators together.

C4: Get Out: Rethinking the Role of the Church in Community

Society is changing. Hierarchical institutions are struggling to compete with organic networks in all layers of society. How might the church respond to this emerging reality? How do we develop models of ministry that look more like organic networks that operate out in the community, rather than inside the walls of our church institutions? In this workshop we will explore these questions and more as we discuss practical strategies for church evangelism and revitalization, drawing on wisdom from the 1001 New Worshiping Communities Movement.

It's significant because that leads directly to the cross ... the tipping point from the cursed fig tree and turned tables, to the Temple's CE 70 destruction and birth of Christianity. Discuss ideas and dramatizations around "Money Changer Monday."

D3: Creating Sacred Space at the End of Life


