To the Synod of the Trinity,

We would like to update you on our process to live-stream Worship. We started on Easter Sunday, 2020, with a remote Worship Service with borrowed equipment and borrowed Zoom from the Pastor's home. On July the 5th we live-streamed a worship service from our Sanctuary with the still borrowed equipment.

Thanks to the Technology Grant provided by the Synod of the Trinity, we were able to live-stream worship on July 19th with our own equipment. We have purchased a laptop computer, Web camera, microphone, tri-pod, USB cables, our own ZOOM account and Weebly. We feel that the first phase of the project has been successful. We average 5 families watching from home on Sundays and the service is recorded and can be viewed at any time during the week at presbykane.com.

The second phase of the project will involve working with a sound technician to tie our existing analog sound board into our recording laptop. We will hire a professional to accomplish the second phase. We hope to work out the audio glitches and improve the recorded sound of the organ. Music is a very important part of our worship! This week we offered music by the Handbell Choir. Members of the congregation have been very appreciative of the effort we have made to keep us all connected.

The Worship Committee is considering other ways to bring the Worship experience into the homes of our shut-ins and keeping us all in touch during these times of isolation. Possibly a bible study or sharing a Mission Project.
