Synod of the Trinity Gathering and Retreat 2026

Workshop Descriptions and Leadership

Workshop Session I. (Friday Morning 10:45 am – 11:45 am):

1. “Exploring Leadership as a fruit of the Spirit”

Our purpose will be to discover the joy of leadership when a position in leadership is offered. During our time together will lead to the qualities of leadership that parallel our PW Purpose. **Pam Snyder, Moderator of PW Churchwide will be our leader**

2. “UN Commission on the Status of Women”

Hear the first-hand experience of our own **Bettie Stammerjohn** at the 2026 meeting of the United National Commission on the Status of Women. Learn how Presbyterian Women work in partnership and collaboration with Presbyterian Ministry at the United Nations to advocate for gender equality and women’s empowerment at the international level and how we carry this advocacy back to our own communities. Bettie is currently serving as our Synod coordinator for Leadership, Resources and Communications.

3. “Radical Welcome: The Key to Communications With the Larger Community”

In this workshop we will explore an in-depth look at how our churches, presbyteries, and gathering spaces have perpetuated harm & oppression for many and how we can help to center the voices, concerns, and interests of those often not fully embraced within the church or society. Participants will discover how radical hospitality blesses our communities, enriching our dialog and creating greater engagement with the larger community. This workshop will be led **by Samantha Davis (Sam)**. Sam is a native of Pittsburgh and grew up in Grace Memorial Presbyterian Church. Samantha is serving as the Associate of Gender, Racial and Intercultural Justice and is an organizer with Free DC and Founder of the Black Swan on national committees within the Presbyterian Church, USA: Black Women and Girls Advocacy Task Force and the Self Development of People.

4. PW Horizons Bible Study 2026-27

“United Through Christ, Bound to Each Other: Paul’s First Letter to the Corinthians”

Workshop Session II (Friday 1:30-2:30)

5. “Mulanje Mission College of Nursing and Midwifery in Malawi” – Our Synod Mission Project 2026

Participants will learn how our one time giving will enhance this program for students of the Nursing College, led by **Rev. Paula Cooper**. Paula served eight years as the regional liaison for East Central Africa, facilitating PC(USA) relationships with partner churches and institutions in Kenya, Malawi, Rwanda and Zambia where the church is growing rapidly and pastoral training and leadership development are of major concern. Paula has provided support for PC(USA) mission personnel and Young Adult Volunteers (YAVs) in the region. She is a lifelong Presbyterian and completed her seminary training (M.Div.) at Pittsburgh Presbyterian Theological Seminary.

6. The Joy Workshop

When we offer up what gives us joy inside community, God connects us and multiplies our gifts! We are all multifaceted women with many finely developed gifts that we routinely use in our ministries. But connecting and reconnecting through what brings us joy is unmistakably different. Let's explore together how we're not meant to be just hard workers, but rather workers living in the overflow of God's love and the Holy Spirit's gift of joy. **Rev. Sharon Woomer** will lead this workshop. Sharon is a Presbyterian minister and the founding Pastor of Hope Community church, a new worshipping community that has emerged from an outreach ministry with Haitian neighbors in Charleroi, Pennsylvania

7. Joy in the Spirit Walk

A guided walk on the beautiful grounds of Antiochian Village. This walk will be led by **Rev. Betsy McCormick** our PW Synod Chaplain. Walking shoes and a hat!

PWS Bylaws Changes

At our October 6-8, 2025 Administrative Team / Coordinating Team meeting we reviewed our By-Laws and will be voting on proposed changes at our PW Synod Gathering Business Meeting at Antiochian Village on July 18, 2026.

The two changes made and proposed (Article IV Section 4-B and Article VI Section 4) need to be brought before the PW Presbyteries of the Synod of the Trinity at least 60 days prior to our July 18, 2026 meeting. See attachment next page.

The rationale for these changes are:

- With Lackawanna and Lehigh Presbyteries combining to form Mountain Laurel Presbytery, Synod of Trinity now has only 15 Presbyteries.
- Many of our Presbyteries have fewer or no active Presbyterian Groups.
- Serving two terms is consistent with many local congregations.

By-Laws 2023

Article IV

Leaders: Elected and Terms of Office

Section 4 Terms of Office

B. Leaders shall not succeed themselves in the same office with the exception of the Treasurer, who may serve two (2) consecutive terms. Leaders shall not serve in than one leadership position in Presbyterian Women in the Synod of the Trinity.

Article VI Gatherings

Section 4 The quorum for the Gatherings of Presbyterian Women in the Synod of the Trinity shall be members representing at least (11) of the sixteen (16) Presbyteries within the Synod of the Trinity. A quorum for Gatherings of the Presbyterian Women in the Synod of the Trinity which are held in geographical areas of the Synod of the Trinity shall be all who are present and are members of the organization. All members present shall be entitled to vote.

Proposed By-Laws 2026

Article IV

Leaders: Elected and Terms of Office

Section 4 Terms of Office

B. ¹Leaders may serve no more than two (2) consecutive terms in the same leadership position. Leaders shall not serve in more than one leadership position in Presbyterian Women in the Synod of the Trinity.

*This does not include the Synod Representative to PW Board of Directors, as this position is Churchwide and under their By-Laws.

Article VI Gatherings

Section 4 The quorum for the Gatherings of Presbyterian Women in the Synod of the Trinity shall be members representing at least seven (7) of the fifteen (15) Presbyteries within the Synod of the Trinity. A quorum for Gatherings of the Presbyterian Women in the Synod of the Trinity which are held in geographical areas of the Synod of the Trinity shall be all who are present and are members of the organization. All members present shall be entitled to vote.

Synod of the Trinity PW Mission Project 2026

Mulanje Mission College of Nursing and Midwifery (MMCNM)

a member of the Christian Health Association of Malawi (CHAM), is owned by the Church of Central African Presbyterian (CCAP), Blantyre Synod.

It was established in 1930 by Scottish Missionaries.

Our one time giving will provide the resources need to purchase critical equipment for the current skills laboratory to ensure proper training. It allows students to gain hands – on experience in a simulated clinical environment.

The skills laboratory is a replica of the hospital where skills demonstration takes place and students take time to perfect their nursing and midwifery skills before they are allocated to the hospitals. The current skills laboratory equipment required by standards includes mannequins that students would use for various skills practice, such as wound dressing, bed bathing, feeding, cannulation, oxygenation, resuscitation, a pregnant mannequin for antenatal, labor delivery, and postpartum skills. Mannequin for neonate care

Mortality rates in Sub – Saharan Africa, with a recent estimated Maternal Mortality Ratio (MMR) of 381 per 100,000 live births. The most common causes of these maternal deaths are preventable and are attributed to inequalities in access to quality health services. According to the World Bank report (2022), 82.02% of people in Malawi live in rural areas where access to quality health care is a challenge. <https://mbf.org/ccap-mulanje-college-of-health-sciences/>

PW Synod Racial Equity Dialogue (RED) Team Update

Members of the RED Team met via zoom in February 23rd. Our RED Team selected to listen to an episode of the **October 27th Podcast - Audrey**.

October 27th is a podcast that tells the story of the 2018 Pittsburgh synagogue shooting through the voices of the local community. Each episode introduces us to the story of a person who experienced the synagogue shooting and its aftermath: survivors and family members of those who were killed, Jewish community members, and their non-Jewish neighbors. **October 27th** is adapted from [Meanings of October 27th](#), an oral history project that interviewed over 100 Pittsburghers about their life stories and reflections on the shooting.

Audrey Glickman is a member of the Tree of Life Congregation and a survivor of the October 27th, 2018 synagogue shooting in Pittsburgh. In this episode, she shares about growing up Jewish in Pittsburgh and her experience of surviving the attack and its aftermath. This interview is adapted from an oral history interview conducted by Aliza Becker with Audrey on December 9, 2019 for the Meanings of October 27th oral history project.

United Nations 70th Commission on the Status of Women

The Presbyterian Women, Inc., along with the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) will have a joint delegation participating at the U.N.'s 70th Commission on the Status of Women (CSW) held in New York City March 9-19.

Bettie Stammerjohn, our PWS Leadership, Resources & Communication Coordinator, was selected to serve as one of the Presbyterian Women delegates. Bettie will be attending events in New York City from March 6-13 and will be able to attend some events virtually from home, March 16-19. She is the only delegate from the Synod of the Trinity (covering Pennsylvania, most of West Virginia and part of Ohio). Bettie will be one of 60 plus Presbyterian delegates attending official and parallel events hosted by the UN Women, Ecumenical Women and the NGO CSW/NY.

Additionally, Suzanne Herger, our PWS Mission Coordinator, will be attending as an observer. Suzanne will be able to attend many parallel events hosted by the NGO CSW/NY, along with connecting with our PW and PC(U.S.A.) delegates and activities.

CSW is the principal global intergovernmental body exclusively dedicated to the promotion of gender equality and the empowerment of women. We are proud to be a part of this community of over 5,000 participants from around the world, including UN Member States, UN programs, agencies, and civil society who come together to further gender equity.

The priority theme for the 70th session is *“Ensuring and strengthening access to justice for all women and girls, including by promoting inclusive and equitable legal systems, eliminating discriminatory laws, policies, and practices, and addressing structural barriers”* The review theme is *“Women’s full and effective participation and decision making in public life, as well as the elimination of violence, for achieving gender equality and the empowerment of all women and girls ([agreed conclusions of the sixty-fifth session](#))”*.

Bettie will have the opportunity to attend various meetings, workshops, seminars and briefings addressing many topics around the priority and review themes. Additionally, she will be able to attend some sessions as the U.N. member states review and debate the recommendations developed from these conversations.

While we often think gender equality and the empowerment of women as more of a third world country issue, please remember that women everywhere experience social, economic, employment, political and other forms of gender discrimination including sexual and physical violence, even in the United States.

The United States is one of only six United Nations member states — and the only industrialized democracy — that hasn’t joined the U.N. **Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW)**. The other non-signatory countries are Iran, Sudan, Somalia, Palau and Tonga. CEDAW was adopted by the UN in 1979 and signed by President Carter in 1980. But the U.S. Senate has never ratified it.

Please keep Bettie and Suzanne in your prayers and thoughts as they attend this monumental gathering in March.


Introducing the 2026–2027 PW/*Horizons* Bible Study

United Through Christ, Bound to Each Other

Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians

Join Presbyterian Women and learn about Paul's first letter to the church in Corinth. This Bible study explores the letter's setting, divisions within the congregation, and ultimately, the gifts given to all through the work of Christ. Readers will be fascinated by this journey to Corinth and will explore how Paul's timeless message of loving unity calls Christ's followers today.



Although First Corinthians contains familiar theology and passages we easily recognize—like the words of institution for the Lord's Supper and the meditation on love—readers often don't realize that Paul wrote this letter to a church in conflict.

Paul founded the congregation in Corinth around the year 50 and later moved to Ephesus, a few hundred miles away. From there Paul wrote a letter to the Corinthians trying to help settle their disputes. He saw that the church was lacking in love, and their conflicts were betraying God's saving act in the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

The church in Corinth was diverse, and it was easy for factions to form. In his letter, Paul called his siblings in faith to a loving unity rooted in the reality that Jesus Christ had been crucified and resurrected for *everyone*. Christians throughout the ages have recognized the Holy Spirit's influence on Paul's words of unity and love, especially during times of conflict.

Paul wrote at a time when Christians expected Jesus' imminent return, and he challenged all to be ready when that day came. Today the church is still waiting, still affirming that Jesus will return, and still proclaiming that this world has already been transformed by God's life-giving love. This Bible study challenges us to trust in Christ's saving love and to demonstrate that love by the way we live.
